This simple orientation will help you get started with Cricut'" cartridges. TIP. For more detailed instructions, refer to the User Manual included with your Cricut" machine.

1. Plug in and turn on your Cricut" machine. Place the Keypad Overlay on the Cricut"' keypad.

## 2. Insert the cartridge.

TIP: It is recommended that you turn your Cricut" machine off before removing a cartridge and that you wait to turn it back on until after inserting a new cartridge.

## 3. Prepare the Cutting Mat.

TIP: The surface of the mat has been treated to make it slightly tacky.
A. Pemove the clear plastic cover.
B. Place a $6^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ sheet of paper on the Cutting Mat. Press and smooth from the center to the edges of the mat.
C. Gently press paper and mat against the roller bar.
(You wrill feel a slight resistance.)


## 4. Press the Load Paper key.

The paper will be pulled into the Gicut" machine.

TIP: Your Gricut" machine needs 12" of clear space in the front and back for paper movement in and out of the Gricut" machine. If your paper does not load correctly, press the Unload Paper key and try again.


## 5. Select characters you want to cut.

(Vou can select up to 16 characters. They will be displayed on the LCD screen abowe the keypad.)

## 6. Select size.

Roll the Size Dial on the right-hand side of the Gicut" machine until the desired size appears in the LCD screen. For example, if the LCD screen displays $3^{\prime \prime}$, your character will be cut $3^{"}$ tall.

TIP: For detailed instructions and ackanoed applications refer to the Advanoed Features section of $t$ his handbook.


## 7. Press the CUT button.

TIP: Only one size may be selected per cut, and that size will be applied to all characters on the L(D screen when you press CUT.

## 8. Press the Unload Paper key.

The paper and mat wrill be ejected from the Cricut" machine.


9. Remove paper from Cutting Mat.

TIP: Gricut" Tools are available to help you remove your cuts from the Cutting Mat.

The capabilities of your Cricut ${ }^{\text {t"M }}$ Personal Electronic Cutter ${ }^{\text {r" }}$ are very broad and versatile!
The next section, Advanced Features, will introduce some of the exciting advanced techniques available to you.

TIP: Wee suggest that you practice on less expensive paper first, until your expected results are consistent.

## Important Keys and Buttons

These will help you with advanced cuts.


The STOP button adjacent to the CUT button will stop any operation in progress. The Blade Navigation Buttons move the blade to any location on the paper.

How to use the Shift and Shift Lock keys



To select a character from the upper right corner of a key, use the Shift key on the keypad. You don't need to hold it down. Just press Shift once and make your selection.

Use the Shift Lock key to select more than one character at a time from the upper right cormers of keys. Press the Shift Lock key again to deselect it.

## What Is Real Dial Size?

All characters are measured from the lowest possible point to the highest possible point. In Wialk in Myy Garden", all black (nor-shifted) characters are created at the same height. The grey (shifted) characters are layers that fit proportionately to the black. If Real Dial Size is selected all characters will be cut according to the selected dial size.


## What Are Creative Feature Keys?

The top three pairs of keys on the left panel are reserved for the Greative Feature effects of each set. These Features vary with each specific cartridge, providing greater versatility and thousands of options!

The Creative Feature keys included on the Walk in My Garden" cartridge ane Card, Bread Tag, Tag, Border, Shadow, and Blackout.

To use a Creative Feature key, just select it prior to pressing the CUT button. The characters displayed on the $L(\mathcal{D}$ screen will then be cut in the style of the selected Creat ive Feat ure. Due to their sizes and shapes, a Feature may not work with all shapes. Please refer to the Icon Gallery for Creative Feature details.


TIP: A Feature can be selected before or after a character has been selected but before the CUT button is pressed. Once pressed, a Feature key wrill remain lit until it is turred off in one of the following mays: the Feature key is pressed a second time, the Raset All key is pressed, or a different Feature is selected. Only one Creative Feature key can be selected for each cut, and that Feature will be applied to all characters on the LCD screen.

## What Is a Foundation Key?

Your 'walk in My Garden" cartridge contains four Foundation keys with two characters on each key. Foundation shapes are the solid wersion of images that were used as Geative Features, or proportional images that Creat we Feat ure keys can be used with. These proportional images are Foundation/Companion shapes and are identified with an arrow. Foundation Shapes and Foundation/Companion shapes can be used alone or as layers using the Creative Feature keys. They can also be enhanced by adding shapes or phrases to them.


Frequently Asked Questions (For updated information about the Cricut" Personal Electronic Cutter" visit monow cricut. com) How does the Cricut" machine work and what size images can it cut?
The Cricut* Personal Electronic Cutter" is a cartridge-based cutting system. The blade is guided by an electronic cutting process.
The Gricut" machine cuts characters ranging from $1^{1 "}$ to $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ tall, as well as titles and borders as long as 11 ".
What kind of paper can the Cricut" machine cut?
The Cricut" Personal Electronic Cutter" can cut a wide range of paper from wellum to cardst ock up to 0.5 mm thick. Provo Craft has created cardstock pads and designer paper pads that coordinate with the Gricut" shape cartridges. These papers fit perfectly in the Gicut" machine.
Will I waste paper trying to get just a few images cut?
No. The Cricut" machire has an option called Paper Saver that cuts characters in an arrangement that minimizes the amount of waste from every cut.
Do I have to hold down the Shitt key to use it?
No. Just press it down once and it will be backlit in green, indicating that it is in use.
Are the Creative Features the same for each cartridge?
Only the Shadow Feature is the same for each set. The other fiwe Creatwe Features are unique to each individual cartridge.
How long will the cutting blacle last?
Arywhere from 500 to 1500 cuts, depending on what kind of paper/cardstock you use. Feplacement blades are inexpensive and easy to change. Fefer to the "Replacing the Cutting Elade" section in the Gicut" User Manual.
How Iong will the Cutting Mat last?
Between 25 and 40 full-page cuts, depending on the size of the cuts and what kind of paperfcardstock you use. We recommend that you use several mats, rotating them often. This will extend the owerall life of each mat.

Frequently Asked Questions (For updated information about the Gicut* Personal Electronic Cutter" visit monorcricut.com)
Can I use paper smaller than $6^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ ?
Absolutely! Just align a corner of the smaller paper to the bottom left correr of the Cutting Mat. Once the mat is loaded use the Blade Navigation Buttons to move the cutting blade down to the upper right comer of the paper. Then press Set Papor Size on the keypad cwerlay.
Do I have to finish cutting a full page before unloading?
No. You can unload the paper and remowe just the pieces you need. You can then reload the paper at a later time and navigate to any open area to resume cutting. If you immediately use the same paper for your next cut, press the Load Last key instead of Load Paper. This will automatically return the cutting head to the last place it was cutting from.
What is the Paper Saver mode?
Paper Saver adjusts images upward or dowrmord to minimize paper waste. This may result in an inaccurate "negative" shape left in the paper, but if you don't need to use the negatiwe cut, this function works great. EXAMPLE: The tail on a lowercase "y" usually extends into the paper below the rest of the letters selected, indicating accurate readability. With Paper Saver selected, your Cricut* machire will automatically raise the "y" up so that the tail doesn't extend below the baseline of the other letters.
What does Real Dial Size do?
By default, your Cricut" machire will cut characters in proportion to each other. However, if you want to "break" this proportion and get any character to out at the literal dial size, press the Real Dial Size key. EXAMPLE: With the Size Dial set at 2", a lowercase "a" will actually cut out at approximately 1 " to fit proportionately with any other cut letter. Wif th Real Dial Size selected, that same "a" would cut at a full 2 ". How is a character cut me asured? From the lowest possible point to the highest possible point.
What is the best way to transport my Cricuf" machine? The Cricut" machine meighs only 9 lbs . and is easily transported. A specially designed tote is available with handy pockets and soft-touch zipper closures. It has in-line wheels for easy maneuvering
and a pull-up handle. It is mell padded to protect your Cricut" machine.

Troubleshooting (For updated information about the Cricut" Fersonal Electronic Cutter" visit monow.cricut.com)
Froblem: The Cutting Mat won't load when I press the Load Paper key.
Solution: Try pressing the mat slightly into the roller bar as you press the Load Paper key.
Froblem: The mat didn't load when I pressed Load Paper. Now, when I try to press it again, it doesn't do anything. Solution: You need to press Unload Paper first. Your Cricut" machire "thought" that it loaded the mat, even though it didn't pull it in. So it needs to be given the command to unload before another paper load attempt is made. Pressing the Unload Paper key will reset the roller bar, allowing for another paper load attempt.

Problem: The blade is not cutt ing all the way through the paper.
Possible Solution 1: Increase the cut pressure using the Pressure Dial on the left side of the Cricut" machine.
Possible Solution 2: Adjust the blade depth. This may be necessary if you are trying to cut through thicker stock. Fefer to the "Adjusting Blade Depth" section in the Cricut" User Manual.
Possible Solution 3: The cutting blade may be dulled by use. Fefer to the "Replaing the Cutting Elade" section in the Giout" User Manual.
Problem: I can't get a character to cut with the Creative Feature selected.
Solution: Fefer to the Icon Gallery to see which Features work with which characters.

Troubleshooting (For updated information about the Cricut" Personal Electronic Cutter" visit monow. cricut.com)
Problem: The paper lifts off the mat as the Gicut" machine is cutting.
Possible Solution 1: Make sure you press the paper firmly onto the Cutting Mat when sett ing up the cut.
Possible Solution 2: Try using a new mat. Each mat will bast between 25 and 40 full-page cuts, depending on the size of cuts and the kind of paper/cardstock that you use.

Problem: The mat is too sticky. It's ripping the paper when I try to remove it.
Solution: Use a craft knife or the Gicut" Tools (packaged as separate products) to successfully lift the paper/cardstock from the mat. (These are custom tools designed for lifting, pulling, or cleaning up the cut images.)

Froblem: I've put a smaller sized paper on the mat and navigated the blade to the upper right corner but when I cut a line of letters, the blacde returns and starts cutting back at the top of the mat.
Solution: After youve navigated the blade to the upper right correr of the paper, and prior to pressing CUT, you need to press the Set Paper Size key. This will tell your Gicut" machine that you have selected a smaller paper size. Otherorise it "thinks" that a 6 " x 12 " paper is loaded.


## "Thanks a Bunch" Card

Gather your mords of appreciation into a beautiful bouquet and send it on its way to that special someone who took the time to care. You'll brighten their day when you say "thanks a bunch!"

Materials:
White cardstock and a variety of pinks, greens, and oranges Fabric ribbon
Adhesive
Scissors
Stapler


## Step One:

Trim pink cardstock to $8.5^{\prime \prime}$ by $5.5^{\prime \prime}$ and fold in half to make a card. Trim a sheet of white cardstock to 5" by $3.5^{\prime \prime}$ and adhere it to the front of the card.

Step Turo:
Load using pink cardstock, cut a 2 " "daisy2" flower. Using a different shade of pink, cut the same "daisy2" at 1 ". Using orange cardstock press Shift, and then "daisy2." Rotate the size dial back to 2 " and press CUT. Load a different shade of orange and press Shift "daisy 2 " onoe more. Wowe the size dial back down to 1 " and press CUT. Using two shades of green, cut one 5.5 "buttonflomer" (the third flower on the second rown) in one shade, and then ore 3" "buttonflomer" in another shade. Use scissors to trim the flomer tops off.

## Step Three:

Place light orange paper on the Cricut" mat and load it. Set your size dial to 1 " and press Shift "thanks," and then press "abunch. " Press CUT.

Step Four:
Adhere the wrords "thanks a bunch" to the card front. Staple a piece of green ribbon to the larger stem to make the leaves. Place stems to the left of the words. Layer the flower centers together as shown and place onto the flomers. Adhere your flomer pieces over the green stems.

In the Icon Gallery, you will find a diagram for every character on your cartridge. The color change indicates that the image on the upper right is created using the Shift key and the image on the lower left is created without Shift. Using the Icon Gallery, you can see at a glance which Geative Features are available to use with the character that you have selected. You will find that some characters are very detailed and cut better at a larger dial size.
